

<b>Direct Speech</b>	⇒	<b>Indirect Speech</b>
<b>simple present</b> <i>He said, "I go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>simple past</b> <i>He said (that) he went to school every day.</i>
<b>simple past</b> <i>He said, "I went to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>past perfect</b> <i>He said (that) he had gone to school every day.</i>
<b>present perfect</b> <i>He said, "I have gone to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>past perfect</b> <i>He said (that) he had gone to school every day.</i>
<b>present progressive</b> <i>He said, "I am going to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>past progressive</b> <i>He said (that) he was going to school every day.</i>
<b>past progressive</b> <i>He said, "I was going to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>perfect progressive</b> <i>He said (that) he had been going to school every day,</i>
<b>future (will)</b> <i>He said, "I will go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>would + verb name</b> <i>He said (that) he would go to school every day.</i>
<b>future (going to)</b> <i>He said, "I am going to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>present progressive</b> <i>He said (that) he is going to school every day.</i>
		<b>past progressive</b> <i>He said (that) he was going to school every day</i>
<b>Direct Speech</b>	⇒	<b>Indirect Speech</b>
<b>auxiliary + verb name</b> <i>He said, "Do you go to school every day?"</i> <i>He said, "Where do you go to school?"</i>	⇒	<b>simple past</b> <i>He asked me if I went to school every day.*</i> <i>He asked me where I went to school.</i>
<b>imperative</b> <i>He said, "Go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>infinitive</b> <i>He said to go to school every day.</i>

Direct Speech	⇒	Indirect Speech
<b>simple present + simple present</b> <i>He says, "I go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>simple present + simple present</b> <i>He says (that) he goes to school every day.</i>
<b>present perfect + simple present</b> <i>He has said, "I go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>present perfect + simple present</b> <i>He has said (that) he goes to school every day.</i>
<b>past progressive + simple past</b> <i>He was saying, "I went to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>past progressive + simple past</b> <i>He was saying (that) he went to school every day.</i>
	⇒	<b>past progressive + past perfect</b> <i>He was saying (that) he had gone to school every day.</i>
<b>future + simple present</b> <i>He will say, "I go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>future + simple present</b> <i>He will say (that) he goes to school every day.</i>

Direct Speech	⇒	Indirect Speech
<b>can</b> <i>He said, "I can go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>could</b> <i>He said (that) he could go to school every day.</i>
<b>may</b> <i>He said, "I may go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>might</b> <i>He said (that) he might go to school every day.</i>
<b>might</b> <i>He said, "I might go to school every day."</i>		
<b>must</b> <i>He said, "I must go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>had to</b> <i>He said (that) he had to go to school every day.</i>
<b>have to</b> <i>He said, "I have to go to school every day."</i>		
<b>should</b> <i>He said, "I should go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>should</b> <i>He said (that) he should go to school every day.</i>
<b>ought to</b> <i>He said, "I ought to go to school every day."</i>	⇒	<b>ought to</b> <i>He said (that) he ought to go to school every day.</i>
